Mane in Heaven

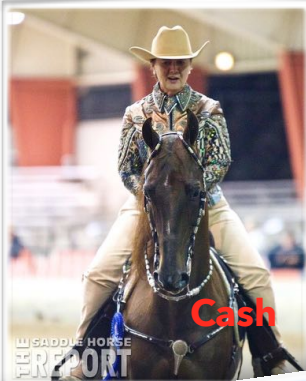
